### Pleasure Island Trolley System Request for Proposals

### **DRAFT**

### Introduction

The Towns of Carolina and Kure Beach are seeking qualified providers and a costanalysis to operate a trolley system throughout Pleasure Island.

This Request for Proposal (RFP) is intended to establish the specifications, terms and conditions governing the selection of a trolley service provider. All proposals shall be in the form and format specified in the RFP section entitled "Proposal Form and Content."

### **Background**

The Pleasure Island municipalities of Carolina and Kure Beach are interested in the feasibility of providing trolley services to visitors and residents at a:

- maximum during the peak seasonal months of May, June, July and August, and
- minimum during the holiday weekends of Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Labor Day.

It is estimated that almost one million people visit the Aquarium each year. They arrive from Southport by way of the Fort Fisher Ferry and by Highway 421, otherwise known as Fort Fisher Boulevard. Fort Fisher Boulevard is the main thoroughfare between the Aquarium/Ferry System and the Snow's Cut Bridge. It is highly congested during the peak seasonal months. A trolley system would provide residents and visitors an alternative mode of transportation to travel to the aquarium and to different amenities in both municipalities.

Additionally, there is limited parking in both municipalities and at prominent hotels as well as piers and restaurants.

Furthermore, the trolley system will provide a spirit of cooperativeness between Island businesses and town councils.

### Scope of Work

The exact scope of work and performance measures required by Carolina and Kure Beach will be set forth in the agreement between the Towns and the selected trolley system provider.

The scope of work for the Provider shall include, but is not limited to, the following services and tasks:

- 1. Establish timed routes between Snow's Cut Bridge and the Aquarium which will include the following drop-off and pick-up points:
  - Food Lion
  - Marriott
  - Boardwalk
  - Specific points of interest in Carolina and Kure Beach
  - Specific beach accesses along Fort Fisher Boulevard
  - Kure Beach Ocean Front Park
  - Kure Beach Pier
  - Fort Fisher State Park
  - Fort Fisher Museum
  - Aquarium
  - Ferry system
- 2. Provide cost analysis & feasibility of operating trolley service to adequately support Pleasure Island
- 3. Establish reasonable fees: Daily, Weekly and Seasonal Passes
- 4. Create annual operating and maintenance budget
- 5. Create annual Marketing Plan and Budget

### **Proposal, Format and Content**

Qualifying proposals must address all of the following points, in the following order:

- 1. **Cover/Transmittal Letter**. This letter must be signed by a member of the Provider with the authority to commit to a contract on behalf of the company offering the proposal. Please acknowledge the receipt of any addenda received, if applicable.
- 2. **Scope of Work**. Describe the plan that you intend to use to complete the tasks listed in the Scope of Work to include route, graphs, photos, diagrams and budgets.
- 3. **Responsible Personnel**. List the principal-in-charge, and others who will be directly involved with the project. Provide a concise statement of qualifications and experience of each person who may be committed to the project.

4. **Marketing Intent**. Provide a brief statement explaining how proposed trolley system may be marketed and blended with existing transportation initiatives.

### 5. Related Experience. Include:

- a. All current towns or entities Provider is contracting with for similar trolley services or contracts completed in the last five years that are comparable.
- b. References with names addresses and phone numbers.
- 6. Corporate Documentation and Financial Information. Provide relevant information regarding organizational stability and strength. This includes a statement of organizational structure (e.g., sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, joint venture, etc.), information regarding the make-up of that structure (e.g., owner, partners, board of director's joint venture partners, etc.), a listing of financial references, a current annual report or audited profit and loss statement and a statement of stability.
- 7. **Provide amounts and carriers** of both general liability and professional liability insurance.
- 8. **Provide a statement of the Provider's philosophy** with respect to cost and budget control, demonstrating experience and ability to provide transportation services within a given budget.

### Consultant Fees

Provide a listing of consultant fees. Break down the fee into labor, subcontractor fees, if any, and expenses. Fees shall include all tax, mark-ups, overhead, and profit. The cost estimate should be broken out into the time estimates and costs for each task identified in the scope of work.

### **Proposal Submittals**

Pages in the proposal shall be typed and single sided with the maximum number of pages of proposal information (excepting cover sheet, index sheet, blank pages, and table of contents) to be limited to forty pages. Only the specifically requested information shall be submitted.

The Provider shall submit an original, unbound, and seven copies of the proposal in a sealed envelope or box clearly marked Pleasure Island Trolley System.

### **Evaluation and Selection**

Proposals will be screened for technical merit by a committee of the Kure Beach and Carolina Beach Town Councils, Town staff and Community Partners prior to interviews being scheduled. The committee will review the written proposals and make recommendations for oral interviews.

The Providers identified by the committee will be invited to attend a meeting at which they will be individually interviewed in random order. The interviews will be conducted in public session; however, the Providers are requested not to be present during the interviews of the other firms.

In addition to the specific factors addressed in the Request for Proposal, the interviews are intended to provide the Towns with information regarding other factors about the Provider important to their decision. These factors include, but are not limited to, its ability to communicate effectively with Council, Town staff, and others who will be involved in the project; its ability to work creatively and cooperatively with the Councils, Town staff, and others who will be involved in the project; and its proposed methods for furnishing the required services to ensure that the project is completed on time, on or under budget, and to the Council's satisfaction.

The Towns shall award a contract to the Provider which presents the proposal that, in the judgment of the Towns, best accomplishes the desired result. The Towns are not obligated to accept any of the proposals submitted or to enter into an agreement with any of the applicants.

Response to League Recommendations/Economic Crisis

The following message is information of significant interest during this economic downturn. Susan, Michelle and I spoke on a number of topics, and I asked that they keep all of council updated on the following:

- 1. Safety of town cash positions regarding FDIC guarantees. Susan and I are awaiting BB&T confirmation that the town is 110% guaranteed. Confirmed.
- 2. Confirmation from outside auditor that the towns audit is on schedule and "problem" free. In progress of confirming.
- 3. Confirmation to town income stream. Water fund annual (fiscal year) income is running at an estimated four percentage points ahead of prior year. County tax collections, sales tax, etc. will be more clearly tracked and projected during first quarter 2009. Slight reduction in the town Powell income reflects new rate and TDA funds require Chamber of Commerce thinking regarding 2009 economic impact. Susan will provided added detail as she completes her study.
- 4. Michelle and Susan are auditing the town grant fund details regarding our sewer project. The issue here is whether or not the town is interested in taking on new debit (and at what bank rate) or delaying the sewer project. Michelle will provide timeline options as part of this study. The WW/Water Rehab Project can be deferred from a grant standpoint. Grant monies must be used by 2010. The project will take three to four months to complete once the contract is issued. We are currently awaiting a permit from the NCDOT. The permit may take a while. Once the permit is issued, it is good for two years. The project, according to our engineer, should be completed in conjunction with other projects which will demolish or closed down Atlantic Avenue.
