Chapter 19, Sec. 373(7)

Temporary political signs may be erected on any privately owned premises. One may erect nonilluminated political signs prior to any primary or general election. Political signs shall be removed after the general or run-off election to which the sign pertains or after the termination of a candidacy, whichever occurs first. Political signs may not exceed six (6) square feet in size. Political signs will not be allowed within the right-of-way in the town limits or its extraterritorial jurisdiction shall not be attached of the most mounted for shall the rest. to trees or utility poles, shall not be roof-mounted, nor shall they be allowed on any publicly owned property. Political signs may be erected within one hundred (100) yards of the town hall or polling place twenty-four (24) hours prior to the scheduled election subject to limits imposed by the New Hanover County Board of Elections.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Chapter 19-373(7)

Political signs may be erected on any privately owned premises. One may erect non-illuminated political signs for a period of seventeen (17) days prior to any primary or general election. Political signs shall be removed five (5) days after the general or run-off election to which the sign pertains or after the termination of a candidacy, whichever occurs first. Political signs may not exceed six (6) square feet in size. Political signs will not be allowed within the right-of-way in the town limits or any publicly owned property. Political signs in the extraterritorial jurisdiction shall be placed near the tree line from the edge of the road. Political sign may be erected within one hundred (100) yards of the Town Hall or polling place twenty-four (24) hours prior to the scheduled election subject to limits imposed by the New Hanover County Board of Elections.
